 $\rightarrow$  The Daily Telegraph is more conservative than The Times. The Times isn't as conservative as The Daily Telegraph.

 $\rightarrow$  This cake is better than that one. That cake isn't as good as this one.

## 8. Cambridge University > Reading University (well known).

 $\rightarrow$  Cambridge University is better known than Reading University. Reading University isn't as well known as Cambridge University.

# 9. A whale > an elephant (big).

 $\rightarrow$  A whale is bigger than an elephant. An elephant isn't as big as a whale.

## 10. He > she (painstaking).

→ He is more painstaking than she is. She isn't as painstaking as he is.
